The Yana Valley Grammar Dug Policy is based upon current principles enhanced by medical, legal and ethical practitioners. These are

- a) Alcohol and ricotine are the major causes of drug related harm.
- b) That any policy should be consistent with the Harm Minimisation approach adopted by State and Federal Governments in Australia, which takes into account the relationships between people, their drug use and the emission ment in which their drug use occurs. A Harm Minimisation approach supports trageted strategies designed to have maximum impact in reducing megative effects of drug use and improving health, social and economic outcomes for the intividual and community.

  Outcomes may include abstinence or prevention of drug use, reduced or controlled use, and safer administration or reduction of the hamful consequences of drug use for the community.
- c) That the cause of dugues is not only experimentation and the 'pusuit of pleasure', but also is often
  perceived asself-medication—to reduce pain or suffering
- d) That a standard approach to drug edy cation de milital library procedures will be t

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The intervention procedure is designed to address incidents of dugue in a way which is in the best interest of all parties, while also conforming to legal requirements.

Yana Valley Grammar does not permit students, while on School premises and whether or not under School supervision, to

- a) Smaletabaccoproducts
- b) Consume or be under their fluence of alcoholic beverages
- d) Deliberately in tale substances such as such as glue, paint, nitrous oxide and petrol
- d) Possess dug related equipment such as syringes (unless prescribed formedical reasons and with the knowledge of the Yana Valley employees) borgs, pipes, nitrous onide cartridges, etc.
- e) Possess, use or be under the influence of drugs prohibited in accordance with the Drugs, Poisons and Controlled Substances Act 1981 (Vio)
- f) Beundertheinfluence of dugs, except formedical reasons

These provisos include all occasions when a student is in School uniform or is representing the School, traveling to and from School, or any camp, excusions, sporting events or other organized function, e.g. disco, formal, social or sporting function

Inespective of what individuals may think or feel, the law regarding the sale or possession of illegal drugs is dear; and paralties are provided for the possecution of offenders.

Wheetheeaeeascrablegounts for supicion of duguse or possession, the Principal or a Hadof School may, in the presence of the student and another teacher; search property such as a bag or search a locker (which is deemed to be the School's property). If the Principal is not part of the search process, then the Principal must be notified of the situation within 24 hours.

Paertsorgradians will be informed if a student is involved in an incident.

Any information provided and scovered will be treated confidentially until attracted investigation has been completed, at which time it may be deemed necessary to reveal such information

Inthecase of student use, possession or intention to supply drugs on the School property, appropriate sanctions will be decided by the Principal, School Heads and other relevant employees, and may involve equation

The School will establish a check list of short-termactions to be taken by employees and is covery of dugues, e.g., lines of communication amongst concerned people

The School will maintain a directory containing local doctors, dirics and agencies to which students with a dug problem can be referred. Copies will be held by the Principal, School Heads, Head of Student Wellbeing the Health Centre and the Chapkain

Students found dirling or intoxicated in possession of alcohol, buying alcohol from other students or supplying alcohol to other students, in any School environment, will be liable to a range of sanctions dependent on the circumstances, at the discretion of the Principal.

This range of sanctions includes

- f) Suspension from School;
- g) Expulsion

## The actions of the School will be consistent with the following guidelines

- a) 'Medication includes all pescribed drugs and all legal non prescribed drugs such as paracetamols, vertolin puffers, etc.
- b) Sturkets who are required to use occasional medication at School should have a written request from their parents/grandlans.
- Medicationused on a long term basis should be recorded by the parent/grandars on the School Medical Form held by the Health Centre
